Professor Claudio M. Martin, MSc, MD, FRCPC, CCPE, is President of the <u>Canadian Critical Care Society</u>. He is Professor in the Department of Medicine, Chair/Chief of <u>Critical Care Western</u>, Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry, Western University and Medical Director of Critical Care at <u>London Health Sciences Centre</u>, <u>Ontario</u>.

1. What are your key areas of interest and research?

Performance measurement and quality improvement.

2. What are the major challenges in your field?

Complex, heterogenous patient population making it difficult to develop standard clinical recommendations.

3. What is your top management tip?

Acknowledge that the best we can do in critical care is practice with evidence-informed opinion.

4. What would you single out as a career highlight?

Working with an amazing team here in London, and receiving the LHSC President's Award in recognition of that.

Prof. Martin is an active member of the <u>Canadian Critical Care Trials Group</u> as an investigator and collaborator in numerous large clinical studies. He maintains a basic science laboratory with expertise in small animal models to study cardiovascular and microcirculatory function in sepsis and haemorrhagic shock. He is on the Scientific Committee of aC3KTionnet, the Canadian Critical Care Knowledge Translation Network. He has been involved in the Ontario Provincial Critical Care Transformation Project and the <u>Canadian Critical Care Vital Signs Scorecard Project</u>. He is also a faculty member and current chair of the Canadian Collaborative for Patient Safety in the ICU.
